Positive Behavior Support In Schools

One of the most commonly reported challenges in school is the presence of persistent behavior and discipline problems. These behaviors divert valuable personnel resources from instruction and disrupts student learning. North Brunswick Township High School has received a technical grant to plan and implement Positive Behavior Supports in Schools (PBSIS) to support the Character Education Program. This initiative is a lifelong change in how our school will plan for and deal with discipline and problem behaviors.

Overview

Positive Behavior Support in Schools (PBSIS) is a partnership between the New Jersey State Department of Education, Office of Special Education Program, State Improvement Grant, the Elizabeth M. Boggs Center on Developmental Disabilities, and the Pediatrics Department at UMDNJ-Robert Wood Johnson Medical School. The goals of the PBSIS initiative is to increase the capacity of local school districts to

develop programs and intervention strategies that reduce occurrences of discipline and behavior problems and subsequently increase student achievement and the inclusion of students with disabilities engaging in challenging behaviors within general education programs.

How Can School Wide Positive Behavior Support Impact Our School?

- Improvements in overall building climate;
- Reduction in office discipline referrals and suspensions for students school-wide;
- Reduction in the number of students who receive repeated office discipline referrals;
- Reduction in the number of students referred for special education services; and
- Increase our districts capacity to educate students with disabilities in general
