The results will only be used by our district for state assessment requirements and will not be utilized by any colleges. Taking Accuplacer is not in lieu of participating in required PARCC testing. 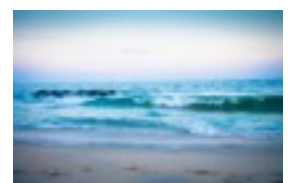
